This year, the theme of Laudato Si' Week, "Seeds of Hope," calls us all to be those seeds of hope in our lives and in our world, rooted in faith and love. The theme is inspired by the Season of Creation 2024 symbol, "firstfruits." This week invites us to come together as a community to contemplate and

nurture seeds of hope for our "suffering planet" (LD 2).

Laudate Deum reminds us of the urgency of the Laudato Si' message and the need for personal and cultural transformation in the midst of our ecological and climate crises.

Our commitment stems from the conviction that, even in times of ecological and climatic crisis, each of us has the power to make a difference and contribute to building a more sustainable future.

Together, we can cultivate a world where harmony between humanity and nature is a tangible reality.

Laudato Si was a pivotal encyclical by Pope Francis calling Catholics around the world to care for our common home, our planet. This encyclical provided the foundation for our College's focus on ecology and sustainability and has led to many whole school initiatives and curriculum integration over the past nine years.

Wellbeing and Engagement Collection Survey – Weeks 3 and 4

Students in our school will be invited to take part in a survey being conducted during week 3 and 4 this term.

Young people's sense of wellbeing is an important part of how they learn at school. The purpose of the survey is to seek students' views about their wellbeing and their engagement with school. Students in year levels 4 to 12 across the State will be invited to participate in the Wellbeing and Engagement Collection. The information collected will help the education system and broader community to support young people's health and wellbeing.

The survey asks students about their social and emotional wellbeing; school relationships and engagement and learning in school; and physical health and wellbeing and after school activities. Students' answers will be kept confidential – no one (including school staff) will use the results to identify individual students.

EY-12 Staff Professional Development Days – 6 and 7 June

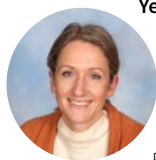
