### From the Principal



### National Reconciliation Week – Now More Than Ever

I thank staff and students for their commitment to National Reconciliation Week. At the heart of reconciliation is the relationship between the broader Australian community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. To foster positive race relations, our relationship must be grounded in a foundation of truth. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples

have long called for a comprehensive process of truth-telling about Australia's colonial history. Our nation's past is reflected in the present, and will continue to play out in future unless we heal historical wounds.

National Reconciliation Week, 27 May to 3 June, is a time for us all to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. For the work of generations past, and the benefit of generations future, we are invited to create a more just, equitable and reconciled country for all.

The National Reconciliation Week theme for 2024, Now More Than Ever, is a reminder to all of us that no matter what, the fight for justice and the rights of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people will —and must —continue. Reconciliation supporters are called to stand up to defend and uphold the rights of First Nations peoples. To call out racism wherever we encounter it, and to actively reinforce the voices of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples across this continent.

Now more than ever, the work continues, whether it be in treaty making, in truth-telling, in understanding our history, in education, and in tackling racism. We need connection, respect, action and change. Now more than ever, we need reconciliation.

#### Timor Leste Charity Ball - Be More, Not Want More

Once again, as part of the Timor-Leste fundraising, we will be holding a Charity Ball this Friday evening, 31 May. The Charity Ball is an opportunity for students in Year 11 and 12 to join together for a night of socialising and dancing at the City Hall – Main Corner while raising much needed funds and awareness for our closest neighbours in Timor-Leste.

Life in Timor Leste is very different to the abundance we enjoy. To embrace the concept of the Charity Ball students are encouraged to donate back money that they saved on their outfit, hair, make up etc. There will a collection box at the entrance for students to make this cash donation if they wish to do so. Secondly, an auction of goods and services will be held on the night, which will be a lot of fun. These will be auctioned for a small monetary amount. Students will not be required to bring cash for this auction, as the winning bidders will have the opportunity to pay at a later date.

We encourage families to have a discussion with their young person, and as much as we want students to look their best, we are hopeful that students will be mindful that in Timor \$50.00 can feed a family of four for a month. If you are purchasing your outfit please consider how many people this would feed in Timor and purchase or borrow thriftily. Conversations around clothes, hair, makeup, corsages and similar could be on the amount saved (and possibly donated) rather than the amount spent.


