#### Staff Professional Learning - Tuesday 11 March

Staff are looking forward to the staff professional development day Tuesday 11 March. The whole school will refine our understandings of the "Tenison Way to Catholic Identity and Mission" The ELCC will commence training in the "Circle of Security" and play based learning, while the Junior School will devote time to the craft of numeracy teaching. The Middle School will be refining their integrated curriculum approach, while the Senior School staff will devote their energies curriculum review.



All sub-schools will also be evolving further our wellbeing approach at the school, focusing on metacognitive competencies through our Resilient IMPACT strategy. Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum will also be completed by staff who are required to complete these critical dimensions of our professional practice.


