#### Lenten Season and Project Compassion – Unite Against Poverty

During Lent students are being encouraged in class to develop a communal action during the Lenten season to bring about change in our world. Fundraising throughout the six weeks of Lent will contribute to **Caritas Australia's Project Compassion Campaign.** Once again, this Lent Caritas Australia calls us to support Project Compassion under the theme of **'Unite Against Poverty,'** which is an expression of hope, and reminds us that the good that we do today will extend and impact the lives of generations to come. It invites us to make the world a better place by working together now and finding long-term solutions to global issues.

#### Free Internet Access

During 2025 the Federal Government is offering an initiative to provide students free internet access until 2028 through the National Broadband Network (NBN).

Called the School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) the program aims to provide NBN's 50 download/20 upload speed tier and is available for up to 30,000 families who meet some criteria:

- Have a school aged student at home (full or part time), enrolled in an Australian school (up to Year 12 including Reception).
- Not have an active NBN network internet service at your current residential address now or in the past 14 days (having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility).
- Live in a premise that can access the NBN network through a standard connection.

To check if you qualify and take advantage of the offer:

Contact the National Referral Centre, on 1800 954 610 (Mon-Fri, 10am-



6pm AEDT), or by clicking here.

- · Callback, webchat and interpreting services are also available.
- The National Referral Centre team will check your residential address and ask you some basic questions to determine if you qualify for the Initiative.



# Project Compassion Caritas BIG Water Walk- Casual Clothes and Gold Coin Donation

On Friday, 4 April, we will be holding our annual Whole School Caritas Event. On this day, students are invited to wear casual clothes and bring along a gold coin for Project Compassion. Throughout the day, classes will walk laps along a designated path through the school grounds, being tasked with different challenges at each stopping point, in solidarity with those worldwide who need to walk long distances for basic necessities and who do not have easy access to safe and drinkable water.

Casual Clothes guidelines-

- Students are to wear neat casual clothes that are appropriate for general learning, including sports clothing if it is a PE day.
- Shoes must comply with safety standards: they must be closed in and protect feet: No thongs, sandals, Ugg boots or heels are to be worn.
- General clothing must be of a respectable standard: no brief or skimpy shorts, tops or skirts, or inappropriate slogans will be accepted.





#### **Giving of Easter Eggs**

At Tenison Woods College we discourage the giving of Easter Eggs during the Lenten season prior to Easter Sunday in line with the liturgical calendar. As we finish off this term, we are still in the Church's Season of Lent, where Catholics fast and abstain from luxury items in the readiness for the Easter event. The focus during Lent and Holy Week, is still on preparing for Easter Sunday when the fast ends and the Resurrection of Jesus Christ is celebrated. Part of the tradition of Easter Sunday is the giving of eggs as a symbol of new life and joy. It is from Easter Sunday, that we enter the season of Easter with 50 days of joy and celebration until Pentecost.

Students who do wish to share the joy of Easter with their friends or class mates are asked to refrain from doing so at school until after Easter.


#### Fish Friday

Not only did students get first hand experience of the way that animals, specifically horses, supported the development of Agriculture but they were also able to see the equipment used.


The lorry the students rode on was used in the Adelaide Hills to transport fruit and vegetables from the market gardens to the fresh produce markets. The lorry also provided examples of technology such as manual brakes and a trailer turn table to compare to modern technology for braking and turning transport vehicles used in Agriculture today.


## SAPSASA District Athletics Day


